1 WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

2 PUBLIC SESSION

3 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING 19th September agreed and signed.

4 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST** in items on the Agenda – None.

5 FROG LANE

.1 Allotments

<u>i</u> <u>Two vacant plots</u> – to advertise. Community Payback Team contacted with a view to clearing both, but still no news they are going to re-start.

ii Proposal for allotment apiary APPENDIX I

- Local residents and beekeepers notified and have responded with advice.
- AGREED great idea in principle. To ensure any concerns are addressed, to consult with

allotment holders and also to first make the opportunity available to the Parish.

.2 Chalk stream

- <u>i</u> <u>Watercress Beds Lease</u> Bates Solicitors instructed to act for the Parish Council re registering the lease, all-in quote of £500.
- ii <u>Phase II 'Island planting'</u> aims to outcompete the Monkey flower, stabilise the island and offer greater variety to pollinators.

.3 Verges

- <u>i</u> Lengthsman has added a single rail protective fence opposite the allotment north gate (to match that across the road) where the stream goes under the road and the edge is breaking away. To protect the road edge and tree roots.
- ii To quote for reinforcing the roadside north of the gateway, to help passing vehicles avoid the vulnerable area (as i. above).

6 VILLAGE HALL GROUNDS

.1 Grounds Maintenance

AGREED with Martin Gosling, he will continue with grounds maintenance contract for 2022 – with the changes as introduced in 2021 and two percent increase as previous years. (Increase in fuel prices noted but the contract changes should offset this.) Additional tasks, including additional cuts of the football pitch to be invoiced separately.

.2 General Maintenance – Harvey Simpson replaced fence posts bordering the car park and fixed the Pavilion downpipe. (Pavilion door threshold mended previously.)

.3 Playground Inspection RoSPA annual inspection attended by Kevin Rafferty. Full report supplied. No major problems, a list of relatively straightforward jobs...

- Additional depth of bark needed around climbing house / slide
- Safety surfaces require cleaning / powerwashing.
- .4 **Tennis courts** have been power jetted. New net post to be ordered.

10 **HIGHWAYS AND RIGHTS OF WAY**

- Five Lanes End Footpaths Warden reported the posts all in need of replacing, a job .1 for contractor, too big a task for volunteers.
- ACTION Chairman to discuss with Friends of St Mary's.
 - .2 Lengthsman funding Recommendation from HCC's September 2021 Transport / Infrastructure Budget Decision Day was to stop funding as from end this financial year. Seems have stepped back from this a little due to opposition from County Councillors, but have determined to end the funding in the near term. A briefing note later issued to County Councillors (8th November) included the following. Whether this means one more year of funding?
 - Parishes have two years to develop other funding streams, including from their precept. `1.
 - Parishes have more financial headroom than County. In order to protect school crossing patrols and HWRCs, these difficult decisions have been unavoidable. The only alternative would be to close care homes and evict elderly and <u>`2</u>. disabled people which we are not prepared to do.
 - '3. HCC will continue to support.'

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.3 20mph speed limit proposals as promoted by Twyford and Dummer via HALC.

AGREED The Parish Council does not support the proposals, though agree that 20mph appropriate in particular village locations.

Footpaths Warden left the meeting with thanks from all present.

.4 Draft budget and Precept 2022/23

TO NOTE – Latest information from BDBC is that grass cutting grant will be usual 1% increase – from HCC that LM funding will be in place for another year.

Draft budget **APPENDIX VII** based on Precept increase of $3\% = \pm 10,325$ a total increase of ± 301 on this year.

Precept for this year 2021/22 is £10,024.

 $\pm 10,024 / 2021/22$ tax base (292.2) = ± 34.31 per annum per Band D household.

Precept request for coming year of £10,325 would be

(estimated on 2021/22 tax base, tax base for 2022/23 will be confirmed in January) $\pm 10,325 / 292.2 = \pm 35.36$ per annum per Band D household, an increase of ± 1.05 . To note this will be double for band H and half for band A.

AGREED: Provisionally a Precept request of 10,325. To be confirmed January meeting.

12 FURTHER UPDATES & REPORTS

1 Barn Meet Hampshire Constabulary's first 'Barn Meet' was organised by CountryWatch in October for Basingstoke Rural South, hosted by Candovers. 'A district-led initiative inviting rural residents and businesses to engage with police and partner agencies – to discuss issues that affect the community and work together to problem solve.' Report included in November *Villager* **APPENDIX VIII** (and November *Rural Times*). Attended by Clerk.

It was made clear at the meet that Rural South will continue to police Mapledurwell & Up Nately, and Newnham, as needed.

(Hampshire's next Barn Meet will be held in Hart.)

- 2 **Canal last 5 miles** Canal society met again in Mapledurwell on 20th October, joined by Chairman. Continue to put pressure on the Council to manage the Little Tunnel bridge as a listed building, continue trying to negotiate access over the strip of land held by the Trust at Canal Reach.
- **3** Adrian Hamilton A memorial service was recently held at Winchester Cathedral for Adrian Hamilton who lived at Blaegrove House for over 30 years and sadly died on Saturday 21 August 2021.

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APPENDIX I.I

Proposed Apiary at Frog Lane Allotments, Mapledurwell

Background

- I am a relatively new beekeeper having just completed my first full season, currently I have a single hive in my garden in Old Basing and am now looking to expand and develop my skills as a beekeeper.
- I am a member of Basingstoke District Beekeepers and the British Beekeeping Association, and in January I completed my BBKA Introduction to Beekeeping Course
- In addition to my own hive, I spend time with a Mentor who has six hives of his own and between us we manage a
 further seven hives on Ewhurst Estate which are being developed on behalf of Basingstoke District Beekeeping
 Association for use as an educational and training site for the local community
- Following initial enquiries to the Parish Council and receiving positive feedback, I met with Colin Robertson at the site and we walked around both the Allotments and the Commemorative Gardens
- The following slides outline:
 - The requirements set out for beekeeping on allotments by BDC
 - Examples of hives and material used in the construction of an apiary
 - Potential locations that have been identified
 - Plan of the proposed apiary layout
 - Next steps

Allotment Beekeeping Guidelines



Rules for Beekeeping on Council Allotments (extract)





- The beekeeper must be a member of the local beekeeping association (Basingstoke District Beekeeping Association BDBKA)
- Have £10m public liability insurance (provided via membership of the British Beekeeping Association BBKA)
- Have attended a basic course in bee management and has access to a Mentor from BDKA
- Must be a tenant of the allotment and bound by its rules
- · Provide emergency contact details, maintain the area around apiary and any related pathway, keeping them clear of vegetation

The Site

- · Requires a 2m mesh screen to force the bees up and above head height
- · The beekeeper will put up a notice advising that beekeeping is taking place and provide an emergency contact number
- Only gentle strains of bees will be kept, if the bees become aggressive then measures must be taken to manage this
- Adequate water provision must be available within the apiary to reduce the need for bees to drink from sources at nearby allotments
- All waste materials must be removed from the site

- Note: These guidelines apply to Basingstoke Council Allotments and I am not sure if the Frog Lane site would be subject to these, but it seems sensible to stick to the principles

Types of Hive



Nucleus box, smaller than a full hive (as seen on the left of the adjoining picture) and used to transport and develop new bee colonies



Two hives with a nucleus box on stands and a woodchip base, up to three hives are proposed in a similar layout



In peak season "supers" are added to increase the area for honey storage, these increase the physical height and potential yield of the hive at this time

Security and Protection










To provide security and minimise the risk to inquisitive visitors I propose to enclose the area in 1.2m wire deer fencing with 2m wooden supporting stakes, this would be overlaid with 2m fine insect mesh to force the bees up and above head height. The front, and part of the North facing side would be screened with three locally sourced 1.8m x 1.8m chestnut hurdles.

Possible Apiary Sites

Second option, closer to existing allotments, less secure and quite close to existing pathways which may cause concern to some users of the site

Preferred location in far South West corner, making use of existing boundaries to limit access / provide security. Opportunity to tidy and make use a "forgotten corner"





APPENDIX VIII – BARN MEET

NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING TEAM

Hampshire Constabulary's first 'Barn Meet' was held on Wednesday 6th October at the Candover Valley Club.

It was organised by CountryWatch, for Basingstoke Rural South area, to include all policing interests – from District Commander, CountryWatch, Neighbourhood Policing to Firearms licensing and Counter Terrorism (re ammonium nitrite).

The meet was for everyone with interest in local policing – landowners and employees, residents, local Councils, Neighbourhood Watch – whether actually part of Rural South or near neighbours.

Much discussion centred on reporting and communication. A Hants 'Disc' community reporting system is to be introduced (Police & Security Community Network Disc system).

Everything comes back to reporting and building intelligence – any sights of suspicious vehicles, licence plate numbers, a quad bike where it shouldn't be... The Police know in many cases who the main perpetrators are, catching them in the act is very difficult. But otherwise providing courts with proof beyond reasonable doubt is also very difficult.

There was unanimous agreement that the event was useful and for similar events to be held on a regular basis.

From the Neighbourhood Policing Team... Thank you so much to everyone who was able to attend our inaugural barn meet on 6th October. It was a fantastic turnout and the glorious sunshine helped to showcase rural Hampshire at its very best. For those who were unable to attend, and as a reminder for those who did, here are the key points:





Chief Inspector Matthew Reeves (District Commander for Basingstoke & Deane) outlined the challenges of policing a borough with such diverse urban and rural issues, and introduced members of the rural Neighbourhood Policing Team and Countrywatch. Firearms Licensing Officer Tony Hill gave an update on firearms licensing and emphasised the need to take security seriously to stop guns getting

Counter Terrorism Security Adviser James Booty spoke about the need to be vigilant and secure fertiliser to help in the fight against terrorism.

Sergeant Stuart Ross from our Countrywatch Team gave an overview of ongoing rural policing operations.

The following Operation names are ongoing: if you believe that one of these offences are taking place, call 999 and refer to the Operation name. Citing the Operation name will activate a trigger plan. [For offences and incidents not currently taking place, report online or to 101.]

- <u>Operation Galileo</u> hare coursing and poaching offences
- <u>Operation Slid</u> theft of ATVs, quad bikes and similar
- <u>Operation Rebate</u> Other rural thefts and burglary from outbuildings. Also...

 Op Liberal is rogue trader awareness to support the vulnerable who are taken advantage of financially

- Op Signature is to identify and support vulnerable victims of fraud eg online or phone call scams.

POLICE FOCUS ON COUNTY LINES

National County Lines Intensification Week, which targets drug traffickers who often recruit children and vulnerable adults to supply drugs across the country, ran from Monday 11th to Sunday 17th October.

Hampshire Constabulary alongside other forces in England and Wales engaged in operations to crackdown on county lines.

Some good news in relation to our Operation Fortress team. While a lot of this might be related to the Town, so much of it is connected to crimes within the rural community.

'Cuckoo' addresses for example play a big part within the rural community and the money used to buy the drugs often comes from crime, including burglaries and other thefts.

Cuckooing is when a drug dealer or a

gang takes over a vulnerable adult's address for criminal purposes, usually as a base to supply, store or produce drugs. Gangs will exploit an individual's vulnerabilities for profit and to avoid police detection.

The Police can only achieve these figures with your help in feeding information back to the Police or Crimestoppers.
